ANIMAL PHYSIOLOGY - UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA

The Department of Biology seeks an animal physiologist for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level. The department offers graduate degrees through the Ph.D. and the campus environment is conducive for building a competitive research program. We are particularly interested in an individual whose research examines the genetic/genomic basis of physiological adaptation to environmental stressors. The candidate will contribute to a new undergraduate program in Molecular and Integrative Biology and actively train graduate students. Teaching duties will not exceed two courses per year during the first several years. Courses taught will include a lecture/lab course that emphasizes vertebrate animal physiology and either participation in a team-taught Introductory Biology course or instruction of an additional advanced course. The successful candidate will be expected to establish a productive and extramurally funded research program. A PhD is required, with post-doctoral experience desirable. Position will begin 16 August 2012. Review of applications will begin October 29 and continue until the position is filled.
