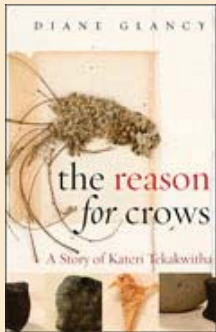

Diane Glancy currently holds the Richard L. Thomas Chair in Creative Writing at Kenyon College. Prior to this position, she taught creative writing for nearly two decades at Macalester College. Frequently drawing upon her surroundings and history for inspiration, Glancy's other work includes *Stone Heart: A Novel of Sacajawea* and *The Man Who Heard the Land*, a story set during the winter and flood of 1997.
