- GRASP members discussed proposal re: student representation at full faculty meeting
 - In the past at full faculty meetings, students have been represented by year (e.g. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th). It was thought that students had ½ vote on voting matters, giving students 2 total votes.
 - There has been some discussion to potentially modify student input from being represented by year to being represented by programs. It was originally thought that this would increase student input (from 2 to 3)

- It was recently noted, however, that students each get 1 vote per year for a total of 4 votes. So the motion would have decreased student input from 4 to 3.
 - Faculty had strong reactions on both sides to this proposal so the motion was tabled during faculty meeting.
 - GRASP members discussed potential alternatives or solutions to this problem.
 - One suggestion was to divide students into the following:
 - MA Clinical
 - MA Experimental
 - MA Forensic
 - Ph.D. Clinical
 - Ph.D. Experimental
 - (Resulting in a total of 5 student votes). Increasing student input, however, may pose difficult to pass in the full faculty meeting
 - To this end, Jo suggested that there be a minimum number of students required to have a vote in a program (e.g. 3)
 - These suggestions were taken into consideration. Future feedback will be solicited via grad student list-serv
